ASSISTED LISTENING DEVICES

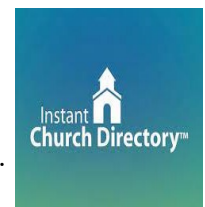
We are very excited that we now have assisted listening devices in the sanctuary that anyone can use. These devices allow people to better hear the service. Each device has a receiver and a set of headphones. Currently located in the back of the sanctuary. You can pick up a receiver from the charging station and a set of headphones from a clean bag. The receivers are already programmed so you just need to plug the headphones into the receiver and put the headphones on.

Healing Ministry



Welcome everyone to our Ministry of Healing. I would like to wish all the fathers a **HAPPY FATHER'S DAY!** A father's blessing strengthens the houses with children. Honor your father by word and deed that his blessing may come upon you. There was a father whose 12 year old daughter was very sick and going to die. The father was a leader of a synagogue of importance (which was often given to especially wealthy people) so they could afford to maintain the buildings as well as plan activities there. About this father, the gospel writer, Mark 5: 21-24, 35-36, 37-43, tells about himself. He was Jairus, means he will enlighten. He did something very courageous to heal his sick girl. He went to the Lord. Jesus Christ, fell at his feet, and asked (Mark 5:23) to lay hands on his 12 year old sick daughter to make her well again. His faith was amazing. In the period of the Lord Jesus Christ, the high priests and Pharisees were against this teaching. Jairus also connected with them at the synagogue. Jairus may be a silent believer of the Lord Jesus Christ as a healer. The Lord was willing to go with Jairus home to heal his daughter. But a messenger came and said that the girl was dead. Jairus never departed from the Lord.



The Lord was saying to Jairus, "If I ignore the message and the girl is not dead. "Like this our faith may disturb by unbelievers. Some may leave their faith and walk away from the Lord. We have to remember and carefully express our faith in Jesus and the hope for eternal life. Our Lord went to Jairus' home. When they went near their homes there were mourners wailing. In the period of the Lord Jesus, the families will hire mourners. The Lord said to them, "Stop wailing that the child is sleeping. The mourners began to laugh at our Lord, Jesus Christ . In Mark 5:31, the Lord Jesus took three disciples Peter, John and James, and the parents inside the home. The Lord lifted up the girl and said two powerful word, " Thali-Tha, Cum, means" Little Girl Get Up." He said in Aramaic language. The little girl was healed from the sickness. We can imagine how astonished and amazed how his wife may have been and amazed the power of the Lord Jesus Christ.

The scripture teaches through Jairus about a father's strong faith. He ignored the policy of the synagogue, he fell at the feet of the Lord Jesus, asked help and believed the Lord's words brought miracle healing for his daughter. Jairus is a modal of today's fathers. He put aside his wealth and position, in the synagogue and he humbled to the Lord brought miracle healing to his daughter.





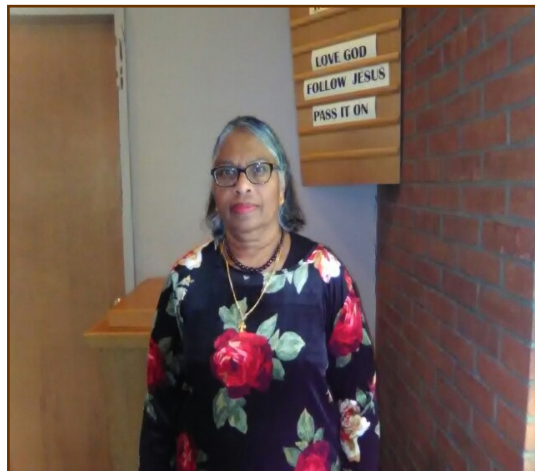
Healing Ministry

SKYE FARM SUMMER CAMP

How about going to Skye Farm Camp in the Adirondacks? Located on 400+ acres of woods and on a lake, it is ideal for swimming, boating, hiking, and many other fun activities.

At an Adventure camp, you can swim, try out a corcl tube, canoe, kayak, experience a rope course, or explore camp on a new-fangled diggler scooter. Or perhaps creativity or artist camp is more your style. Enjoy creating through improv, skits, plays, dance, art, photography, or music. Skye farm also has a Hook, Line and Sinker camp, a Rocks, Ropes and River camp, a Games camp, a Night Owl camp, and other specialty camps. These are all one-week camps, for ages 6 through young adult, with sessions in July and August.

No matter what camp you choose, you will make new friends, sing songs, play games, have camp fires, and go on a wagon ride. However, what makes the Skye Farm experience unique is that it is a United Methodist Christian camp, that means campers will have opportunities to grow in their faith and build life-long connections through living out Christian values, reading the bible, and prayer. Short daily morning chapel services and singing grace at every meal is also part of everyday camp life.

Skye Farm Camp & Retreat Center Funding Request



Skye Farm Camp & Retreat Center is dedicated to the ministry of our local churches as a resource for strengthening relationships with their communities. As Reverend Butler talked about in the May 5th sermon, the camp is still recovering from COVID and has one full time employee, the site director. With camper registration increasing along with the retreat groups use the facilities at the camp increasing, more staff is needed.

Due to the burden of administrative tasks, the site director has had less time to build relationships with local churches, campers and their families, retreat groups and donors. To allow the site director to focus on these essential tasks, helping Sky Farm to reach its full potential as a resource for communities, they are working to hire a full time year-round assistant director. They are asking churches in and around the district to donate to help with their mission goals.

Would you please donate to help Skye Farm Camps to help them be able to continue to reach the unchurched youth and communities into the future? Many of our church members have been campers or summer staff or used the retreat facilities over the years. Skye Farm Camps is a special place. The Mission/Outreach Team has set a goal to donate \$3,000. 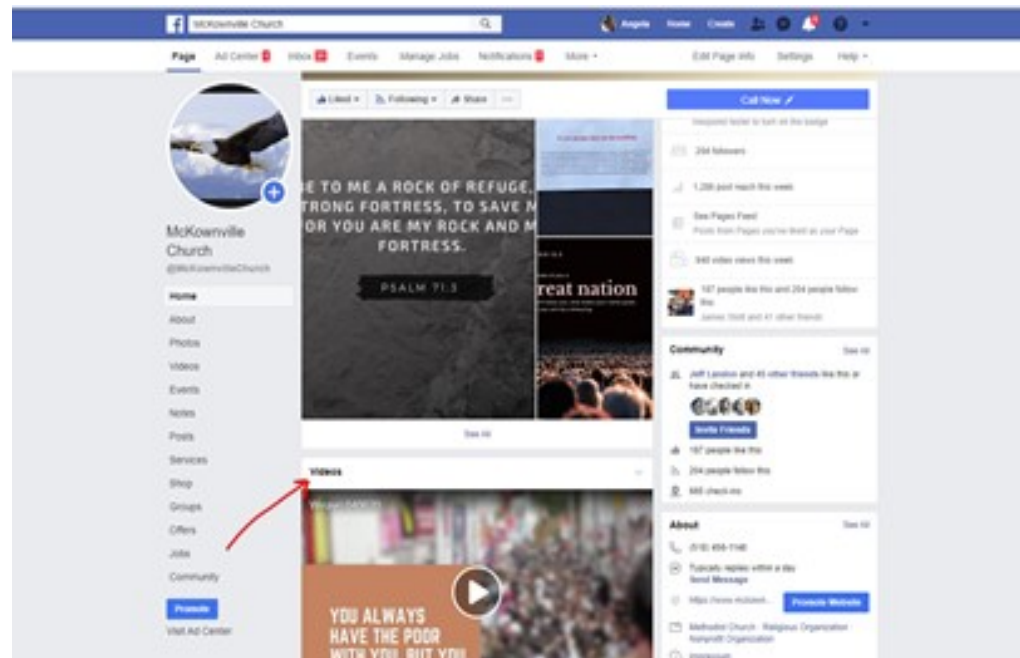
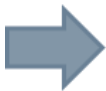

As Worship Leaders, you help set the tone that prepares the congregation for worship. Worship leader notes with service guidelines are in the attached document. (If you cannot open, let me know.)

One copy of the Worship Leader Reference is kept in the pulpit/lectern. The pastor or guest speaker can inform you if there are any changes.

Aids to being Worship Leader:

Service outline and scripture: Look at a copy or email of the worship outline to familiarize yourself with the service for which you will be Lay Worship Leader. This includes the church policy about wearing masks.

Be early and get ready: On Sunday, please arrive at the church fifteen minutes prior to the service for which you are serving and check up front.

The microphone will be turned on; if you are tall or short, you may need to move it closer to your mouth. The visuals team started a 5-minute timer on the monitors to help get the services started on time. The worship leader can begin the greetings to the congregation after the timer counts down to zero and the organist/pianist is seated. In the fall, the Pastor may start handling this and announcements again.

Remember that worship is to God. Thank you for helping the congregants worship.
